Fabrikisto Stitching Frame Stands

Single-sided Stitching Frame Stand



Description

A versatile, well-made open-sided stand and support to hold your stitching project while you work hands-free! With a solid Maple base that's 25 mm (1") thick and $17 \times 40 \text{ cm} / 6.75 \times 16$ " deep and wide, it's stable. Whether you prefer to set it on a table or on your lap, this 2 kg stand will hold your work securely. Either of the arms may be used separately, or combined to give full flexibility of placement.

For transport, the parts may be disassembled, or simply folded flat. Loosening the arm bolts makes it easier to fold the arms.

Assembly and Usage

<u>A</u>ssembly is simple and easily repeatable. Please use the photo as a guide during assembly. **Please read these instructions completely before proceeding!**

- 1. Choose whether to use the longer single arm, or also the shorter arm. The shorter one is 15 cm (6") and the longer one is 25 cm (10")
- 2. If you choose to use both arms, it is assumed that the longer will be attached to the base.
- 3. Remove the knob from the longer arm's bolt, insert the bolt in the hole in the vertical, and reattach the knob. Align the Hirth rotation lock disks. Ensure that the knob isn't cross-threaded on the bolt. If it does not turn freely, back it off and try again. **Do not cross-thread!**
- 4. Repeat with the shorter arm if desired. The shorter arm has a friction disk, ensure that it is on the arm side that connects to the lower arm.
- 5. Remove the knob from the clamp, insert the bolt in the upper hole of the arm, then re-attach the knob, ensuring it is not cross-threaded.
- 6. Mount your frame, hoop, or stretcher bars as desired.
- 7. Tighten all knobs to ensure your work stays in place.
- 8. For transport, loosen all knobs and lay the arm and clamp flat against the base. Re-tighten knobs so things stay in place.

Possible issues

- The arm clamps may not hold the arms firmly in position. Ensure that the Hirth disks are aligned.
- The clamp jaws may bind. Ensure that the jaws are parallel. A light coating of wax on the maple shafts may help ensure smooth action.
